## Structure, governance and management

**Type of governing document**

The activities of the World Day of Prayer in Scotland are directed by the Scottish Committee as governed by its Constitution.

**Trustee recruitment and appointment**

The recommended size of the Committee is 25 members elected by different Christian denominations, representatives of various organisations or interdenominational societies and co-opted member. Committee members usually serve three to five years up to a maximum of 15 years.

## Objectives and activities

### Charitable purposes

Observing the World Day of Prayer each year, the committee aims to encourage the people of Scotland to participate in the World Day of Prayer and to assist financially in the issue of Scripture and various forms of Christian literature designed to advance the Christian faith and way of life throughout the world.

### Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

On Friday 3rd March 2017, The World Day of Prayer was celebrated by people gathering together throughout Scotland in Churches, Eventide Homes, Hospices, Schools and other venues. Individuals also participated in their own homes using printed or pre-recorded material. The theme was 'Receive children, receive me', prepared by Christian women of Cuba.

Through World Day of Prayer, people are encouraged

- To become aware of the whole world and no longer live in isolation
- To be enriched by the faith experience of Christians of other countries and cultures.
- To take up the burdens of other people and pray with and for them
- To become aware of their talents and use them in the service of society

## APPENDIX 1

### Achievements and performance

#### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

During the year under review a grant of £8,000 was given to the Scottish Bible Society, £8,000 to Feed the Minds and £6,000 to the Suriname Charity, £5,000 to the International Committee, £1,000 to the European Committee and £1,000 donation to Senka in Croatia. In recent years' donations, have been made to help those affected by HIV, AIDS or human trafficking. Grants are agreed and made by the committee on an annual basis.

It has been an exciting year for the Scottish Committee as, along with other countries, we applied to the International Committee to host the International Conference in 2022 and the Scottish Committee have won the bid.

The International Conference brings together approx.. 180 people from over 90 countries for an ecumenical gathering of worship, prayer and Fellowship.

### Financial review

#### Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

It is the policy of the Committee to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the Committee at a level which is equivalent to between one and two times the costs of support, management and administration. The Committee consider that this level is appropriate to ensure the ongoing work of World Day of Prayer.

#### Details of any deficit

2018 was very much a problematic year for the World Day of Prayer in the whole of the UK due to the severe weather problems. Nearly all of the services which would have been held at the first Friday of March were cancelled. Some Churches held the service later in the year but many did not resulting in a significant fall in offerings and donations, approx.. 43% fall. Mailings have been sent to all organisers suggesting that if the weather conditions are poor than services should be held later in the year.
