The interdenominational movement of World Day of Prayer invites everyone to attend one of many services being held throughout Scotland on Friday 2nd March with the title “All God’s Creation is Very Good!” We will join an estimated 3 million people around the world that day in a service which has been written this year by the women of Suriname in South America.

Starting in Tuvalu as the sun rises and ending as the sun sets in Alaska, the service will have been translated into more than 95 languages and 1,000 dialects as we are reminded that we have responsibilities in caring for this beautiful world that we live in. With its vast rainforest and wealth of resources, Suriname asks us to pray for conservation and the protection of wildlife, through awareness of pollution, misuse and abuse, as well as for the situation in Suriname and concerns for the future.
